The Northern Mountains

In this chapter we shall about the Northern Mountains the Northern part of India is bordered by the Northern mountains which include the Himalayas the karakaram and the kailash range of mountains. There mountains are like great mountain walls in the northern and north – eastern part of the country. It covers a distance of about 3600 km and the width varies from 150 to 400 km. These are the highest mountains in the world and are snow – capped. The word Himalayas in Sanskrit mean abode of snow.

The three Mountain Ranges:- The Himadri or the Greater Himalayas, the Himachal or the middle Himalayas and the shivalik or the outer Himalayas. The Himadri or The Greater Himalayas. This is the northern most range of mountains which lie in the Tibetan plateau ctoser to china border. The world highest mountain peak mountain Everest (8848 metres) in peak is present in greater Himalayas. The other important peaks here are Nanga Parbat, Nanda Devi, Annapurna and KanchenJunga. These sheets of ice that move are called glaciess Rivers like the Ganga, The Yamuna, The Brahmaputra, The Indus and The Sutlej start from these mountain ranges. The river Ganga begin in the Ganjotri glacess.

Deforestation in this region has destroyed the forests. To prevent this Indian government has ceclared many protected areas in this regaion. The Corbett National Park and The Kaziranga Park are some of the protected areas here.

Climate in the Mountains:- Summer of May and June are not really not in the mountain.

Life in the mountains:- The main occupation of people living in the mountains is farming. The beautiful volleys and lakes are great attraction for the tourists. On Dal lake in Kashmir many people make their living by using boat called shikaras to give rides to tourists.
